





#### DEVELOPED USING WEB ONTOLOGY LANGUAGE (OWL) WITHIN THE ONTOLOGY DEVELOPMENT ENVIRONMENT, PROTÉGÉ

- Definitions are made explicit (formal)
- Greater detail (or granularity)
- Conforms with standards and criteria
  - ISO standards (e.g. ISO 18104:2003)
  - HL7 registered

  - Easier maintenance
  - Greater utility


